

How to submit to QCMC 2012 in several steps

This is the template for submissions to QCMC 2012 (provided from the organizers of the QCMC 2010 [?]). The template should work with any L^AT_EX system since it uses only the QCMC package and no add-ins beyond those included with standard distributions.

Please do not alter any of the commands in the template file. The commands `\titleblock{}`, `\papertitle{}`, `\people{}` and `\affiliation{}` are used to define the title, authors and affiliations and we use these as tags to extract information that goes into the book of abstracts. The main text of the document starts with the `\starttext` command. Keeping all these commands intact will make it possible for us to compile the book of abstracts. All you have to do is take out the dummy title, authors and affiliations and replace them with your own.

You will probably notice that the text flows right to the edge of the page. That is deliberate and nothing to be concerned about. In the end we plan to use the pdf files generated by this template and paste them into a master document, which is why we have no margins.

To begin: Make sure that this template is in a folder along with the file “qcmc.sty”. This style file contains all the bits that make the template work.

The title: Simply change the title in this template from “How to submit to QCMC 2012 in several steps” to something else.

The author list: Underline the presenting author as shown in this template. Use numbers to indicate the affiliations.

Figures: If you want to add a figure (see Fig. ??), save your image as an eps file and use this command:

```
\begin{figure}[h!]\centerline{\includegraphics[width=\columnwidth]{example_figure.eps}}\caption{here you see scientific data.}\label{BirdandMatilda_fig1}\end{figure}
```

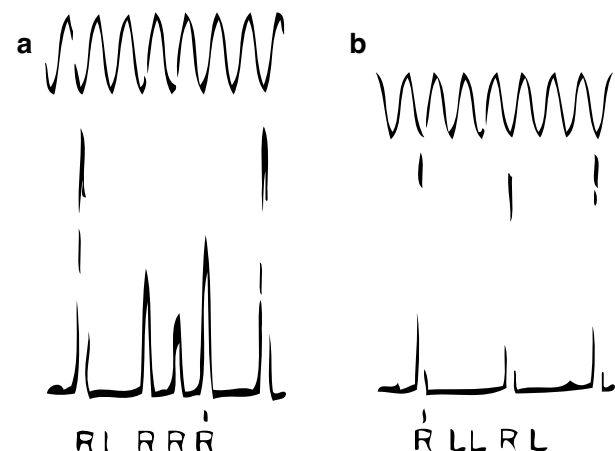


Figure 1: a: blah blah. b: blah blah.

If you want to add multiple figures, it would be best to make them parts *a to z* of a single eps file, otherwise you will probably run out of room for words.

Equations: If you want to add an equation, for example,

$$E = mc^2 \quad (1)$$

then it goes like this:

```
\begin{equation}E=mc^2\label{BirdandMatilda_eq1}\end{equation}
```

Citations: If you wish to add citations, they are done in the usual L^AT_EX manner [?] using `\cite{uvw,xyz}` [?, ?].

Submission format: Now that you have a L^AT_EX file and eps figure(s)...

1. Put them in a folder.
2. Compile the document to generate a pdf file.
3. Submit the .pdf file to the abstract submission form on www.qcmc2012.org.
